Background:

- A part of patients with addictions and concomitant disorders do not use traditional care offers.
- Development of different models of community treatment in the last decades.
- In addiction medicine outreach treatment mainly aims at risk reduction without adequately addressing other needs such as social inclusion.
- Emergence of new models of community-based outreach treatment using recovery orientated practices.
- Focus on increasing strengths, encouraging patients' autonomy and patients' participation in community.
- Strong collaborations with other community stakeholders are necessary.

This research topic intends to present and discuss examples of recovery orientated models for patients with addictions and concomitant disorders.
